Emergency regulations aimed at curbing opioid abuse in Nevada took effect on Friday, January 19, 2018, when the Division of Public and Behavioral Health (DPBH) filed the regulations with the Secretary of State to comply with Assembly Bill 474 (aka the Controlled Substance Abuse Prevention Act). The emergency regulations provide immediate structure to reporting of overdose or suspected overdose cases to assist with the comprehensive response needed to save Nevadans' lives. These regulations are temporary and will only be effective for 120 days until the permanent regulations can be finalized.

This technical bulletin is to introduce and distribute the new form and FAQs for overdose reporting as required in Nevada Administrative Code Chapter 441A.


The form is titled "State of Nevada Overdose Reporting Form" and includes the following sections:

- Provider:** Attending Physician, Physician Phone, Physician Fax, Person Reporting/Job Title, Reporter Phone, Reporter Fax, Facility Name, Facility Phone, Report Date.
- Patient:** Name, Sex (Female, Male), Race (White, Black, Asian, Native American, Pacific Islander, Other), Address, County, City, State, Zip, Transgender (Yes MF, Yes FM, Unknown), Primary Phone, Social Security Number, Pregnancy EDC, Ethnicity (Hispanic, Non-Hispanic), Date of Birth, Marital Status (Single, Divorced, Married, Widowed, Separated, Unknown), Occupation.
- Medical Information:** Disposition of Patient, Previous Known Overdose?, Was laboratory testing ordered?, Attach Results, Medical Record Number, ICD-10 Diagnosis Codes.
- Notes:** A section for additional information.


