## PATIENT RISK ASSESSMENT

In addition to other requirements (see A474, the White Paper, and/or the Chart for further information regarding these requirements, all of which are available on the Board of Dental Examiners' website), AB474 requires the prescriber to complete a Patient Risk Assessment prior to an initial prescription of controlled substances for the treatment of pain. Pursuant to AB474, section 54(1), a Patient Risk Assessment consists of the following:

- 1. Obtaining and reviewing patient medical history;
- 2. Conducting a physical exam of the patient;
- **3.** Making a good faith effort to obtain and review the medical records of the patient from any other provider of health care who has provided care to the patient;
- **4.** Documenting efforts to obtain medical records and the conclusions from reviewing the records;
- **5.** Completing an assessment of the mental health and risk of abuse, dependency and addiction of the patient using methods supported by peer reviewed scientific research and validated by a nationally recognized organization.
