I. **BACKGROUND**

As set forth in NAC 631.2791 through authority of NRS 631.190 and NRS 233B.120, the

the declared policy of the State of Nevada.

Board is authorized to provide advisory opinions.

- 2. It was requested, pursuant to NAC 631.279, the Board issue an advisory opinion regarding the administration of OraVerse by registered dental hygienist.
- 3. Public notice of the above-referenced request for an advisory opinion was provided in accordance with state law.

II. DISCUSSION

Ms. Lancette VanGuilder, RDH, was present and indicated she was requesting an Advisory Opinion by the Board regarding whether hygienists could be allowed to use OraVerse.

Dr. Guillen inquired if the medication would be used after every use of local anesthetic. Ms. VanGuilder indicated that due to the cost per cartridge of OraVerse, the use would be rather restricted. Some of the Board members expressed concern of possible paresthesia. Dr. Pappas commented that anytime a dentist or hygienist reintroduces a needle they run the risk of clipping a nerve, and therefore, causing paresthesia, nevertheless, there's always a risk whenever anyone reintroduces a needle. Dr. Sill indicated that he felt that it would be appropriate for hygienists to use.

III. CONCLUSION

After considering and discussing public comment pursuant to the authority set forth in NAC 631.279, NRS 631.190 and NRS 233B.120, Board Member, Dr. J. Stephen Sill motioned to allow hygienists to use OraVerse under direct supervision of a dentist. The motion was seconded by Board Member Dr. Tony Guillen. After opportunity to discuss the motion a vote

was taken wherein the motion passed unanimously.
