Notice of Hearing for the Adoption and Repeal of Regulations of the Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners

The Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners will hold a Hearing on Friday April 25, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. during a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board at the offices of the Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners, 6010 S. Rainbow Blvd, Suite A-1, Las Vegas, Nevada 89118. Videoconferencing will also be available at the offices of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners, 1105 Terminal Way, Suite 301, Reno, NV 89502.

The purpose of the Hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of the following proposed regulations that pertain to Chapter 631 of the Nevada Administrative Code. The revisions are regarding the following:

Pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603, the following information is provided:

1. Purpose and Need of the Proposed Regulation:

The proposed regulations are necessary to establish Board of Dental Examiners policy and to clarify existing Board of Dental Examiners policy.

2. How to obtain the Revised Text of the Proposed Regulations:

A copy of this notice will be on file at the State Library, 100 Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada for inspection by members of the public during business hours. Additional copies of the notice and the regulations to be adopted and repealed will be available at the office of the Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners, 6010 S. Rainbow Blvd. A-1, Las Vegas, Nevada 89118; and in all counties in which an office of the agency is not maintained, at the main public library, for inspection and copying by members of the public during business hours. This notice is also available on the Board's website at: dental.nv.gov. This notice and the text of the proposed regulations are also available in the State of Nevada Register of Administrative Regulations, which is prepared and published monthly by the Legislative Counsel Bureau

pursuant to NRS 233B.0633, and on the Internet at www.leg.state.nv.us. Copies of this notice and the proposed regulations will also be mailed to members of the public upon request.

3. Estimated Economic effect of the Proposed Permanent Regulations on the Business, which it is to regulate and the Public:

NAC 631,029 Schedule of Fees:

a). Adverse and Beneficial Effect:

This proposed regulation would increase certain fees with regards to certain licensure and anesthesia permits. The beneficial effect would be to ensure the Board has the monetary resources to continue to conduct the required evaluations and inspections needed for the issuance of anesthesia permits to ensure the public's safety, health and welfare.

b). Immediate and Long Tem Effect:

The immediate effect would be an increase to the applicant who applies for or renews an anesthesia permit. The Board does not foresee any long term effects.

c). Method utilized to Determine Economic Effect:

Upon holding two Public Workshops where licensees, members of local associations and societies and public persons attended, the attendees did not object for increasing certain licensure fees in order to implement the policies of the Board. This included, a review of the Board's budget showing the amount of money it is costing the Board to conduct anesthesia evaluations and inspections for the issuance of an anesthesia permit. The Board determined that an increase to certain maximum amounts as set forth in NRS 631.345 was needed to continue the required evaluations and inspections for anesthesia to ensure the public's health, safety and welfare.

d). The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

There should be an minimal cost for enforcement of the proposed regulation to the agency to conduct the evaluations and inspections. The immediate cost would include informing the licensed professionals of the State of Nevada of the change in regulation.

NAC 631.145 Dental Hygienist-Special Endorsement of a license:

a). Adverse and Beneficial Effect:

This proposed regulation would allow for a dental hygienist to renew their special health endorsement permit biennially. This is consistent with the change to NRS 631.287 at the last

legislative session.

b). Immediate and Long Tem Effect:

There should be no adverse effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

c). Method utilized to Determine Economic Effect:

There should be no economic effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

d). The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

There should be no additional cost for enforcement of the proposed regulation to the agency. The immediate cost would include informing the licensed professionals of the State of Nevada of the change in regulation.

NAC 631.173 Continuing Education: required hours:

a). Adverse and Beneficial Effect:

This proposed regulation would allow for licensees to increase the amount of hours they may obtain continuing education through on-line, self-study or home study methods. The beneficial effect is the licensee will have more course subjects and course materials to choose from.

b). Immediate and Long Tem Effect:

There should be no adverse effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

c). Method utilized to Determine Economic Effect:

There should be no economic effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

d). The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

There should be no additional cost for enforcement of the proposed regulation to the agency. The immediate cost would include informing the licensed professionals of the State of Nevada of the change in regulation.

NAC 631.175 Continuing Education: approved subjects:

a). Adverse and Beneficial Effect:

This proposed regulation would allow for licensees to increase the amount of hours they may obtain continuing education through on-line, self-study or home study methods. The beneficial effect is the licensee will have more course subjects and course materials to choose from.

b). Immediate and Long Tem Effect:

There should be no adverse effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

c). Method utilized to Determine Economic Effect:

There should be no economic effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

d). The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

There should be no additional cost for enforcement of the proposed regulation to the agency. The immediate cost would include informing the licensed professionals of the State of Nevada of the change in regulation.

NAC 631.1785 initial inspections:

a). Adverse and Beneficial Effect:

This proposed regulation would utilize language as set forth in NAC 631.179 with regards to random inspection to ensure consistency and to clarify due processes.

b). Immediate and Long Tem Effect:

There should be no adverse effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

c). Method utilized to Determine Economic Effect:

There should be no economic effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

d). The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

There should be no additional cost for enforcement of the proposed regulation to the agency. The immediate cost would include informing the licensed professionals of the State of Nevada of the change in regulation.

NAC 631.2203 registered facility:

a). Adverse and Beneficial Effect:

This proposed regulation change is to remove the wording NAC 631.2207 the regulation the Board has proposed to repeal.

b). Immediate and Long Tem Effect:

There should be no adverse effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

c). Method utilized to Determine Economic Effect:

There should be no economic effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

d). The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

There should be no additional cost for enforcement of the proposed regulation to the agency. The immediate cost would include informing the licensed professionals of the State of Nevada of the change in regulation.

NAC 631.230 Unprofessional conduct:

a). Adverse and Beneficial Effect:

This proposed regulation change would add language that if a dentist who is registered to dispense controlled substances has failed to conduct a minimum of one self query annually to the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy Task Force the Board would deem the failure as unprofessional conduct. The beneficial effect to the licensee and the public is to ensure the dentist is aware of all controlled substances being filled under his DEA and Controlled Substance permit and make the dentist aware of how many controlled substances he is issuing.

b). Immediate and Long Tem Effect:

The long term effect will hopefully result in a reduction in fraudulent controlled substances being obtained.

c). Method utilized to Determine Economic Effect:

There should be no economic effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

d). The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

There should be no additional cost for enforcement of the proposed regulation to the agency. The immediate cost would include informing the licensed professionals of the State of Nevada of the change in regulation.

NAC 631.260 Radiographic procedures

a). Adverse and Beneficial Effect:

This proposed regulation would require the dentist to attest that each such employee receive adequate training in CPR, infection control and a copy of this chapter and chapter 631 of NRS in paper or electronic format. The beneficial effects will result in public safety and ensure the employee is fully aware of the duties delegable to them.

b). Immediate and Long Tem Effect:

The immediate and long term effect is to ensure the public's health, safety and welfare.

c). Method utilized to Determine Economic Effect:

There should be no economic effect of the changes in the regulations on the dental or dental hygiene profession.

d). The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

There should be no additional cost for enforcement of the proposed regulation to the agency. The immediate cost would include informing the licensed professionals of the State of Nevada of the change in regulation.

4. A description of any duplication or overlapping of other local, state, or federal agencies,

To our knowledge, there are no other government entities regulating the licensure of dentists and/or dental hygienists in the State of Nevada. Therefore, there is no duplication or overlap of regulation of another agency.

5. If the regulation is required pursuant to federal law, a citation and description of the federal law.

This regulation is not required pursuant to federal law.

6. If the regulation includes provisions which are more stringent than a federal regulation that regulates the same activity, a summary of such provisions.

There are no federal regulations addressing state dental and/or dental hygiene.

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel stated that on December 13, 2013 a workshop was held to review of the administrative codes. This is the second public workshop to request comment and consideration of recommendations from the Legislative and Dental Practice Act Resource Group. Ms. Shaffer-Kugel noted to the Board pursuant to state law the Board must review the regulations every ten (10) years. The Board has reviewed all regulations with the exception of anesthesia due to the statutory change required before amending any anesthesia regulation. In addition, Ms. Shaffer-Kugel indicated a submission from the Nevada Dental Association with recommendation to amend NAC 631.260 regarding dental assistants. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel went through each recommendation and repeals of all regulations reviewed (attached for the record).

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel discussed NAC <u>631.029</u> regarding fee changes and the repeal of fees. Dr. Miller stated that he agreed with the fees, and that the fees need to be increased to allow for the Board to break even. He added, however, that the site permit inspection requires one evaluator only, therefore, suggested that perhaps only increasing the fee to five-hundred dollars (\$500). Mrs. Wark inquired on what the average cost is for each type of inspection. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel noted to her that there has been a request from the anesthesia evaluators to receive a pay increase, thus the increase in fees will also allow for the evaluators to be granted a greater compensation. She noted to the Board that the recommended fee changes are the current statute maximum. Any changes to the maximum would require a statute change. Dr. Miller suggested increasing the fee to five-hundred dollars (\$500) for the site permit application, until the Board can show what it costs the Board to conduct an inspection.

 MOTION: (NAC 631.029) Dr. Miller made the motion to raise the site permit application fee be raised from \$350 to \$500. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pisani. Discussion: Mrs. Villigan inquired of Mrs. Hummel, based on her evaluation of the Board budget, if the increase to \$500 is reasonable? Mrs. Hummel indicated that the Board was taking a big loss, therefore, yes, an increase is needed. She added that she will be happy to go back and do an analysis to see how the change in fees would affect the Board. Dr. Sill indicated that with the evaluators wanting an increase in pay, the increase in application fees needs to be able to cover the Board expenses. All were in favor of the motion; Mrs. Wark was not in favor of the motion.

(NAC 631.029) → Dr. Miller suggested that fee for the Biennial permit to administer general anesthesia, conscious sedation, or deep sedation, be changed from \$300 to \$200. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel noted to the Board that to get permitted through the health bureau, it costs thousands of dollars, the Boards' fee is a huge costs savings to the licensees in comparison.

MOTION: Dr. Miller made the motion to change the application fee for an administration permit from \$300 to \$200. The motion was second by Dr. Sill. All were in favor of the motion.

Dr. Miller noted to the Board that the statutes does not address a fee for the infection control inspections, and therefore, suggested adding a fee for initial inspections of new offices so that the Board does not continue to incur the expenses for these inspections.

MOTION: Dr. Pinther made the motion to accept the recommended fee changes and both motion changes. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Villigan. All were in favor of the motion.

NAC 631.031 – Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that the committee recommended repealing this regulation because the Secretary/Treasurer reviews the applications, thus, making the regulation unnecessary.

MOTION: Mrs. Villigan made the motion to repeal the regulation. The motion was seconded by Dr. Blasco. All were in favor of the motion.

NAC 631.039 – Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that this regulation was no longer valid because temporary licensure was no longer an option since it was sunsetted in 2006.

MOTION: Dr. Blasco made the motion to repeal the regulation. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pisani. All were in favor of the motion.

NAC 631.045 – Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that the legislature is taking another approach to control the abuse for controlled substances. She indicated that this regulation would require that every dentist attest on their renewal requiring dentist to run a minimum of one self query annually to review their prescription history to check for any potential fraud. She noted that this regulation would only be applicable for those who hold a controlled substance permit through the Nevada State Board of Pharacy. Mr. Hunt indicated to the Board that the Attorney General may make this a statewide statute, due of the issues prescription abuse and fraud has recently drawn. Dr. Kinard noted that there will be a link on the Board website where dentists will be able to run their reports. Mrs. Shaffer reiterated that on their renewals dentist will attest that they have a run a report at least once annually for each biennial renewal period.

MOTION: Dr. Pinther made the motion to recommend approval of this regulation. The motion was seconded by Dr. Blasco. All were in favor of the motion.

NAC 631.060 – Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that this regulation would require that an applicant who has been denied licensure to petition the Board for permission to reapply. Mr. Hunt indicated that this regulation would require an unnecessary step for applicants.

MOTION: Mrs. Solie made the motion to accept to repeal this regulation. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pinther. All were in favor of the motion.

NAC 631.080 - Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that this regulation was regarding examinations and cheating

170 prohibitions, however, the Board no longer administers an exam. 171 172 MOTION: Mrs. Solie made the motion to repeal this regulation. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pinther. 173 All were in favor of the motion. 174 175 NAC 631.100 - Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that this regulation was regarding an exam to practice dental 176 hygiene; however, the Board no longer administers an exam. 177 178 MOTION: Dr. Pinther made the motion to repeal. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Wark. All were in favor 179 of the motion. 180 181 NAC 631.120 - Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that this regulation listed the procedures for an exam; the 182 Board no longer administers an exam. 183 184 MOTION: Dr. Blasco made the motion to repeal the regulation. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pisani. All 185 were in favor of the motion. 186 187 NAC 631.130 - Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that this regulation was exam related, which is now moot. 188 189 MOTION: Dr. Pinther made the motion to repeal the regulation. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Guillen. 190 All were in favor of the motion. 191 192 NAC 631.145 – Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that in the last legislative session there was a statute change 193 allowing for Public Health Endorsement (PHE) holders to renew their endorsements biennially in 194 conjunction with their license renewal. Mrs. Solie suggested, perhaps, making an editorial change to 195 remove the phrase "in the prior year" regarding PHE reports. 196 197 MOTION: Dr. Pinther made the motion to approve the regulation with the recommended language change. 198 The motion was seconded by Mrs. Solie. All were in favor of the motion. 199 200 NAC 631.1785 - Mr. Hunt indicated that in original regulation there was a summary suspension for critical 201 errors, board can now summary suspend without needing to go before the Board first, which will now be 202 added as section (5). 203 204 MOTION: Dr. Miller made the motion to approve added section (5) to the regulation. The motion was 205 seconded by Mrs. Villigan. All were in favor of the motion. 206 207 NAC 631.180 - Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that this regulation was created prior to the existence of the 208 UNLV School of Dental Medicine; therefore, the current statute supersedes the regulation. 209 210 MOTION: Dr. Miller made the motion to repeal this regulation. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pinther. All 211 were in favor of the motion. 212 213 NAC 631.2207 - Mr. Hunt indicated that after litigation with LVI, the original ruling was upheld by the district 214 court. Therefore, the Board must abide by the statute. 215 216 MOTION: Dr. Pinther made the motion to repeal the regulation. The motion was seconded by Dr. Blasco. 217 Discussion: Per Dr. Miller, Mr. Hunt indicated that the application only requires that they have graduated 218 from an accredited school and pay application fee. All were in favor of the motion. 219 220 NAC 631.260 - Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that at the Legislative and Dental Practice Act committee meeting, Dr. Robert Talley with the Nevada Dental Association (NDA), suggested that some changes be 221 222 added, such as attesting that their dental assistant has received CPR training, and they have received at 223 least four hours of training in infection control. She noted to the Board that the NDA and NDHA were both in

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agreement with these proposed changes.

MOTION: Dr. Miller made the motion to amend the regulation to add a section (e) requiring that they the dentist attest that they provided the dental assistant, prior to employment, a copy of the NRS and NAC 631 rules, also that they have made them familiar to the items received. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Solie. Public comment: Dr. Pappas commented that in the electronic age, perhaps, the Board could add to the language that they can be provided the link to the statutes and regulations versus a physical book. Dr. Miller accepted to amend his motion accordingly. Mrs. Solie agreed to amend her second to motion accordingly. All were in favor of the motion.

NAC 631.230 – Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated section (u) was added to indicate that if a dentist fails to conduct the required self-query report annually, it will be deemed unprofessional conduct.

MOTION: Dr. Pinther made the motion to approve the amendment to the regulation. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Guillen. All were in favor of the motion.

Dear Board Members:

I am writing to ask for an advisory opinion from the Board, regarding our company policy for consent for dental treatment for minors. My goal is to revise our existing policy, such that it will protect the best interest of children, and ensure that our providers are conforming to the legal requirements for the consent of treatment for said children. My providers and I have reviewed the Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 631, and the Nevada Administrative Codes Chapter 631. We have not been able to clearly define our responsibility, based on the law.

The statutes we are referencing are as follows:

NAC 631.2237 Procedures required before administration of anesthetic or sedation; This statute says: "If a patient is a minor, the consent must be obtained from his or her parent or legal guardian."

NAC 631.230 Unprofessional conduct. This statute says: "The failure to obtain a patient's written, informed consent before administering general anesthesia, deep sedation or conscious sedation to the patient or, if the patient is a minor, the failure to obtain his or her parent's or guardian's consent unless the dentist determines that an emergency situation exists in which delaying the procedure to obtain the consent would likely cause permanent injury to the patient."

Nevada Health Centers, Inc. Parental Consent for Dental Treatment of a Minor

Initial Visit/ Recall Visit/ True Emergency Visit:

- Any minor, (any person under the age of 18) will need to be accompanied by a
 parent or legal guardian in order to be seen by a Dentist in the clinic for an initial
 visit or recall visit. Exceptions are listed below and proper documentation is
 mandatory with no exceptions:
 - a. Any adult family member or temporary caretaker with a written notarized consent affidavit (typed or written note) from a parent or legal guardian will be accepted to ensure a minor can be seen in the clinic for an examination (which includes x-rays) for diagnosis of dental needs.
 - b. Any person appointed or granted by a court to consent medical or dental treatment of a minor is acceptable. Proper Court documentation is mandatory before examination can be completed.
 - c. Any Emancipated Minor shall be considered an adult for the purpose of consent to any dental examination or procedure as long as the minor has received a "declaration of emancipation" from the court. Documentation is as follows:
 - i. Provide a copy of emancipation decree and/or
 - ii. Completed MR1.07Fc Documentation of Self-Sufficient Minor Status
 - d. Any emergency situation where immediate intervention is warranted due to trauma or any other truly emergent condition. This decision should be made by the attending Dentist.
 - i. Patient can be examined
 - ii. Patient may receive treatment if the attending doctor feels treatment is warranted and necessary. This can be done without parental consent, but a call to the parent or legal guardian will be attempted.
 - iii. The documentation in the minor's chart should adequately describe the situation.

Treatment Appointment: Minor without Accompanied Caretaker

- 1) Any adult acting as a temporary caretaker with a written notarized consent affidavit (typed or written note) from a parent or legal guardian will be accepted to ensure the minor can be seen for treatment in the clinic:
 - a. Any treatment will need to be authorized by the parent or legal guardian with at least a signed copy of the minors' treatment plan before ANY treatment can begin.
 - i. If an adult temporary caretaker is accompanying a minor for treatment, a phone call to the parent or legal guardian should be attempted and recorded in chart before treatment begins.
 - ii. Note: Attending Dentist has the right to require parent or legal guardian supervision at any appointment they feel may require more consent than the treatment plan describes. This notification will happen before an appointment to assure compliance from Parent/Guardian and to mitigate rescheduling.
- 2) Any adult with a written notarized consent affidavit (typed or written note) from a parent or legal guardian will need to remain at the facility while treatment is being conducted. A minor may **not** be dropped off for treatment.

We do not need to obtain a Parental Consent if the following applies:

- An emergency situation where immediate intervention is warranted due to trauma
 or any other truly emergent condition. This decision should be made by the
 attending Dentist.
 - i. Patient can be examined
 - ii. Patient may receive treatment if the attending doctor feels treatment is warranted and necessary. This can be done without parental consent, but a call to the parent or legal guardian will be attempted.
 - iii. The documentation in the minor's chart should adequately describe the situation.
- 3) Parent is accompanying the child.
- 4) Legal Guardian is accompanying the child.
 - i. Must have legal documentation in chart of legal guardianship.
 - ii. Legal guardian must sign financial agreement.
- 5) The minor is emancipated.
 - i. Provide a copy of emancipation decree and/or
 - ii. Completed MR1.07Fc Documentation of Self-Sufficient Minor Status
