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#### 1. Call to Order

Chairman Thompson called the meeting to order at approximately 6:00 p.m. Mr. Dworin conducted roll call. Quorum was met.

Comments by the public may be limited to three (3) minutes as a reasonable time, place and manner restriction, but may not be limited based upon viewpoint. The Chairperson may allow additional time at his/her discretion.

- \*3. Chairman's Report: W. Todd Thompson, DMD (For Possible Action)
  - \*a. Request to Remove Agenda Item(s) (For Possible Action)

There was no request to remove any agenda item(s).

\*b. Approve Agenda (For Possible Action)

Dr. Johl made a motion to approve the agenda. Dr. West seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion passed.

- \*4. New Business: (For Possible Action)
  - \*a. <u>Discussion, consideration, and possible recommendation to the Board regarding the hiring of part-time on-site evaluators/inspectors including raising hourly wages from \$50.00 per hour and outreach to potential new evaluators/inspectors— NRS 631.190 (For Possible Action)</u>

Dr. Thompson introduced the agenda item and noted that there have been employee changes at the Board resulting in issues with scheduling anesthesia evaluations. Dr. Thompson invited the members to review the list of current inspectors, noting there are only 15 inspectors for the state of Nevada. Dr. Twesme recommended reaching out to Dr. Manny Rapp, who had previously been an inspector. Dr. Thompson invited discussion on how to recruit additional inspectors. Dr. Gray shared that he has traveled

to remote locations including an overnight stay and has not been paid more than \$150. Dr. Okundaye stated that anesthesia inspectors are giving up a full day of their cases in order to complete inspections but are not paid more than \$150. This makes it very difficult to recruit more anesthesia inspectors. Dr. Gray suggested an incentive for attracting anesthesia evaluators may be to offer continuing education (CE) credits for each evaluation that is completed.

Dr. West made the recommendation to increase the payment for anesthesia evaluators to \$250 per evaluation, increase the mileage reimbursement, reimburse for hotel/meals, offer CE credits for each

Dr. West made the recommendation to increase the payment for anesthesia evaluators to \$250 per evaluation, increase the mileage reimbursement, reimburse for hotel/meals, offer CE credits for each evaluation, and waive the Board's inspection fee for their biennial renewal. Mr. Dworin clarified that personal mileage rate is set each year by the IRS and cannot be changed, and the current policy is to pay \$50 per hour of travel time for remote locations. Mr. Dworin, Dr. Thompson and Dr. Okundaye discussed the possibility of providing CE credits for evaluations. Dr. Okundaye suggested scheduling semiannual calibration sessions for the anesthesia inspectors and providing CE credit for their participation.

Dr. Twesme recommended increasing the fees for initial on-site anesthesia evaluations and annual renewals commensurate to the cost of the evaluations/inspections. Drs. Johnson, Saxe, Twesme, Johl and Thompson discussed the failure rate for initial inspections and 5-year renewal of permits, and the additional costs for re-inspections at sites that fail initial inspection. Only 15 states require an on-site inspection every 5-years. Dr. Johl suggested that renewals can be streamlined and conducted remotely. Dr. Twesme concurred. Dr. Thompson recommended that this discussion be considered and continued at a future meeting.

Dr. Gray requested reconsideration of the zero-complaint policy for evaluators that have complaints filed against them without merit. Dr. Johl recommended that this be considered on an individual basis.

Drs. Thompson and Gray discussed the reimbursement for inspections. They recommended that the fee remain a flat fee at \$250 for each inspection. Dr. Gray recommended that the Board also provide 4 CE credits for each inspection in order to attract more inspectors.

Dr. Thompson made a motion to pay each inspector \$250 per site inspection, the standard personal mileage rate per the IRS, and provide 4 hours CE credit per site inspection. Dr. West seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion passed.

## \*b. <u>Discussion, consideration, and possible recommendation to the Board to hire the following as a part-time on-site evaluator/inspector – NRS 631.190</u> (For Possible Action)

### (1) Drew D Richards, DDS

Dr. Thompson introduced the agenda item and reminded the members of the confidential nature of some of the material. Dr. Thompson stated that any dentist licensed in the State of Nevada who holds an anesthesia permit is eligible for the position of anesthesia inspector, and that there is no policy stating that the dentist must not have any complaints filed against them. Mr. Dworin concurred with the eligibility requirements and further stated that the Board considers the applicant's background and experience to determine whether or not to hire them as an examiner. Theoretically, it may be an issue if an applicant has a pending complaint which would create a conflict. Dr. Gray stated that he made a recommendation regarding a past applicant who was denied due to a frivolous complaint. Dr. Thompson stated that the staff at the Board has recently changed, and guidelines need to be reviewed and set by this Committee.

Dr. Thompson provided a brief review of the Dr. Richard's application. Dr. West noted that the complaint was made in 2006. Dr. West made a motion to approve the application of Dr. Richards. Dr. Johl seconded the motion. Dr. Okundaye interjected that if the complaint is not related to anesthesia, it does not preclude consideration of a dentist as an anesthesia evaluator. She recommended Dr. Richards as an anesthesia evaluator for ages 13 years and older. Dr. Gray stated that there is a real need for additional evaluators in Northern Nevada. Dr. Saxe will recruit evaluators during the upcoming Nevada Academy of Pediatric Dentistry meeting in January.

Dr. Thompson called for a vote on the motion put forward by Dr. West. All were in favor. None were opposed. Motion passed.

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### \*c. Discussion by Board members regarding any new items members may wish to add to future agendas for consideration at upcoming meetings

Dr. Thompson introduced the agenda item. He reiterated Dr. Okundaye's proposal regarding an annual or semiannual calibration meeting. Dr. Okundaye stated that the meeting could be held either in person or virtually with all current evaluators, and each course could cover different anesthesia topics (e.g., medical emergencies, updated anesthesia pharmacokinetics, pharmacology, new medical emergency drugs, etc.). The CE Committee could create/approve the course. She shared that other states have a mandated annual calibration meeting that is typically 16 credit hours over a weekend. Dr. Thompson and Dr. Okundaye stated this calibration meeting would exceed the mandated anesthesia CEs for dentists.

Mr. Dworin stated that the Board is most in need of moderate anesthesia evaluators, and the Board needs to increase outreach to recruit dentists who hold an anesthesia permit. Dr. Gray asked about eligibility of retired dentists. Dr. Twesme and Mr. Dworin responded that the requirement includes an active Nevada license and anesthesia permit.

Dr. Thompson recapped the agenda items for future meetings, including the possibility of virtual inspections for 5-year renewals. Dr. Johnson noted that he is aware of a few dentists in Nevada who hold a conscious sedation license who are hiring certified registered nurse anesthetists (CRNA) to administer anesthesia. He expressed concern that dentists unable to monitor or supervise anesthesia are having anesthesia administered in their office. He made a call for investigation. Current regulation allows for a dentist with a general anesthesia license to supervise a CRNA; however, an unsupervised CRNA is against regulations. Dr. Thompson clarified that Nevada regulation allows for a CRNA properly licensed by the Medical Board to administer anesthesia in an accredited surgery center. Mr. Dworin requested the members inform the Board of any violations they are aware of. Mr. Dworin and Dr. Johl informed the committee that at the November 8th meeting of the full Board an authorized investigation was approved and opened to investigate a dentist who has employed a CRNA anesthetist at their practice. Dr. Okundaye stated that she is aware of three general dental practices that have CRNAs not under NAC 631.224, but using a facility accredited by The Joint Commission under NRS 449.442. It is not clear what a "health center" is defined as. Dr. West recommended working with the Medical Board.

Dr. Saxe requested follow-up from the April 2021 Anesthesia Committee Meeting. The committee recommended that pediatric sedation scenarios be rewritten, which Dr. Saxe did and sent to the Board for implementation. However, these suggestions have not yet been adopted. He requested that the minutes be revisited to ensure that the recommended changes to the NAC be implemented during the upcoming legislative session. Dr. Johl requested that Dr. Saxe provide a copy of his notes to the current Anesthesia Coordinator, Karla Martinec.

Dr. Twesme requested clarification that Dr. Richards will be providing both on-site inspections and evaluations. Dr. Thompson confirmed and added the inspections and evaluations will be for moderate sedation for 13 years and older.

With the recent increased demand in Nevada for oral surgeons and pediatric, periodontist, and dental specialties, Dr. Johl expressed concern regarding surgeons flying to a location for a day or two to perform procedures and then leaving without providing follow-up for their patients. He expressed concern that the surgeons are not assigning local dentists to provide follow-up care for potential complications. These patients need to rely on the Emergency Department and are left without medical information regarding their recent procedure. Dr. Johl has noted a significant increase in surgeons that are part-time and travel to Nevada for a couple days. He is concerned about safety issues for the consumer regarding complications. Dr. Gray shared that he investigated a complaint in the past in which a patient was hospitalized after receiving care in Reno by a surgeon who flew in from Las Vegas. The surgeon's dental office was not comfortable referring the patient to other local oral surgeons, and the patient had to go to the Emergency Room for treatment. He concurred with Dr. Johl and expressed concern that these patients are essentially abandoned. Dr. Johl suggested that the evaluation form include a section regarding assignment and availability of a local on-call physicians in the absence of the surgeon. Dr. Okundaye clarified that the Board cannot regulate a surgeon's postoperative plan. At most, inspectors can ask what the surgeon's postoperative pain management protocol, but the Board cannot mandate

the surgeon's postoperative management. There was further discussion, and concern expressed by Dr. Gray and Dr. Johl about patients having to go to the Emergency Department for postoperative complications.
